PARTNERS IN THE HARVEST (PITH) CONFERENCE & MISSION EXPOSURE TRIPS

Six (6) mission exposure trip options to various countries are available following the PITH Conference held in Phuket, Thailand. Mission trip participants will be required to attend at least one online pre-trip orientation, and meet their team during the PITH Conference. The PITH Conference runs from 25 to 28 July, with the mission exposure trips commencing directly afterwards, from 29 July to 2 August.

OPTION 1: Chiang Mai, Thailand • 5-10 participants

OPTION 6: Palawan, Philippines • 5-15 participants
